Family Dance Time is designed for a caregiver and child (age 1.5 - 3) to move, sing and play together. From classical, world music and joyful sing-alongs we use themes appropriate to healthy social development of the child in community. Physicalizing the natural world and the animals within it helps families imagine and tell stories with their bodies. As a community, we ground, rise, dance and soothe.

**Creative Movement**

Creative Movement is a class for children (ages 4-5) to safely explore their body's movement, expression and spatial awareness. **Music Initiation**

In this program, children will be able to explore various percussion instruments and connect them to basic musical figures and elements. The predominant instruments in this workshop are Boomwhackers, colorful bells, maracas, drums, and xylophones as well as other materials such as colored ribbons and musical figures on paper to begin to recognize the elements of music visually. Kodaly will be used as a method to enter the name of the musical notes.

Hip Hop

Students will build confidence while experiencing the joy and freedom of hip hop dance fundamentals, in an encouraging and fun environment, with the freshest (and kidappropriate) music and moves! The goal of this class is to help students further their developmental agility by learning movement phrases that emphasize dynamics, musicality, isolations of body parts, and locomotion. The class structure emphasizes building stamina, coordination, and teamwork through practice and play.

This is an invitation-only "rock band" class where students will play rock songs as a group. Band members/instruments include guitar (up to three), bass guitar, drums, vocals (up to three), keyboard/piano, and another percussionist (depending on need, availability, and appropriateness to the music). The group will determine what songs to play and perform live, either at the showcase or other venues, pending invitations and availability. Students will be offered a spot in the class based on their instrument proficiency, past performance, and an assessment of skill, as determined by Sitar staff. This is an opportunity for Sitar students who are proficient in their instruments to branch into other types of music, including rock, hard rock, metal, indie, soft rock, ska, punk, alternative, and more.

Held in Sitar's deLaski Theater, this is an opportunity for students to rehearse their music and performances throughout the semester rather than just for a single event at the end of the semester. This class will help students increase their confidence and preparedness for a showcase performance. They will develop their own custom sound, lighting, and stage design, setting them apart. Students interested in music and stage production, whether as performers or non-performers, can manage the soundboard and lightboard and gain experience in stage setup and placement. Students will develop comfort playing on stage while getting a say in how they sound, look, and position themselves.

#### **MONDAY**

**Upcycling Fashion** 

4th - 8th

In this class we will use recycled materials to create a new piece every two or three weeks. Along the way we will go over how we can consume fashion more sustainably and what we should look at when buying new clothes and refashioning some of our old items. The culminating project will include one garment to present at a fashion show at the end of the semester.

Students will dive into the rhythms and melodies of rock, jazz, R&B, and Latin music, learning to perform a wide range of styles that will broaden their musical horizons in a band. By the end of the semester, students will showcase their talents in a live performance, demonstrating their growth as versatile, confident musicians! This class is for students enrolled in a private lesson: drums, bass, guitar, piano, vocals, violin, woodwinds, or brass.

6:00 - 7:00 PM

**Face Painting** 

4th - 8th

This course will introduce students to face painting, starting with the basics of using professional face paints, brushes, sponges, and stencils. They will combine simple techniques and eventually gain the skills to create full-face designs like animal masks, floral patterns, holiday-themed art, and more! Using FDA-approved facepaints, the students will have the chance to practice on themselves, and each other. By the end of the course they will have the skills to imagine and create their own facepaint designs.

6:00 - 7:00 PM

Introduction to Fashion Design

9th - Adult

Students will get an introduction to fashion design, starting from research and development, up to designing a final garment. In the beginning, we will focus on developing a sense of design, looking at – of art, the environment, and clothes we already have, to gather inspiration. We will also practice drawing, including figure drawing and sketching, so as to prepare us for drawing out designs. We will also experiment with textile creation, – over how we can create different textiles through manipulation, dyeing, washing, melting, etc. We will practice draping textiles on the body, to simulate our designs. There will be a sewing demo, but sewing is not required. The culminating project will include one final garment to show at a fashion show at the end of the semester.

#### **TUESDAY**

Students will learn pre-ballet by way of creative movement and will gradually progress to beginner ballet technique introducing them to the foundation of classical ballet at a developmentally appropriate level. Students will exercise creativity, imagination, rhythm, and motion while developing body awareness, increased strength, agility, and motor coordination.

4:30 - 5:15 PM Broadway Bound: 3rd - 6th Kristina Friedgen Beginning Musical Theatre

Calling all Broadway Babies! Get ready to sing and dance as we work on performing group songs from a range of Broadway musicals. Students will work on healthy singing habits, projection, basic acting techniques, and introductory musical theatre dance techniques.

4:30 - 5:30 PM Eco Art Explorers K - 2nd Hope Glastris

In this class, we will use a mix of art supplies and objects we can find in our indoor and outdoor environments, to create artwork inspired by the natural world. We will use our imagination and our senses to explore how we can use different kinds of materials when we create. Activities will include both 2D and 3D, and there will also be some collaborative projects to encourage sharing and interaction.

4:30 - 5:30 PM DCJF: Jazzin' Afterschool 4th - 12th Herman Burney

Jazzin' Afterschool is a partnership class with the DC Jazz Festival where students can learn from professional jazz musicians! This class will focus on ensemble playing, jazz rhythms, and experimenting with different instruments. All levels are welcome!

4:30-6:00 PM Digital Photography 5th - 8th Gregg Adams

The class will cover the basic camera operations and basic editing techniques through Photoshop and similar editing programs. Street Photography or the capturing the moments of everyday life in the public will be the theme of the Fall Semester Class. Students will learn about the work of Sergio Larrain, Graciela Iturbide, Daniel Hernandez-Salazar and others.

5:30 - 6:30 PM Art Journey Studio 1st - 3rd Kelsey Bachenberg & Alejandra Giraldo

Each week we'll explore and combine different mediums and techniques to create both 2D and 3D art pieces. Projects will combine elements of craft (using fiber, paper, recycled materials, and more) and art, allowing students to maximize their creativity to produce unique works of art.

Enhance your singing and acting skills in this musical theatre performance class. Students will create epic character performances by working on solos or duets and group songs.

In this collage class, students will get to unleash their creativity and explore the power of art for activism. Students will experiment with various materials and techniques to create thought-provoking collages that raise awareness and inspire action.

This class is designed for students who want to develop their vocal technique, singing skills, and learn how to sing with others. And the best part of it, it will be taught in English and Spanish!

5:00 - 6:00 PM Movement, Meditation 7th - Adult Justin Howell & Self-defense

This class combines breath, relaxation and posture to heal and protect ourselves. Classes will begin with breath work from a lying down position developing awareness by utilizing relaxation and tension. We will come to standing and walking emphasizing fluid movements, practical techniques and psychological training to deal with potential and real threats. We will work alone, with partners, and as a group to cultivate our health and strength. Learning how to find relaxation in any situation will help all participants as individuals and community members to effectively handle the challenges life will present.

5:30 - 6:30 PM My Voice, My Movie 4th - 7th Daniela Delgado

Cinematography is the art of storytelling through images. Using iPads and iMovie software, students will develop basic skills to write, direct, film, and edit a one-minute movie. In this class, students will learn the importance of lighting, sound, camera movement and framing to find your creative voice and tell your story.

#### **THURSDAY**

Welcome to the String Ensemble, where you'll learn how to play beautiful music, work with friends, strengthen and streamline your fingers, and develop superpowers of concentration, all while having a blast!
